

Message from the Department Chair



Welcome Wayne State University Department of Dermatology Alumni to our Alumni Newsletter:

We will attempt to update you on the current state of the department. The Department of Dermatology has many endowed chairs and research funds thanks to the generosity of many of our alumni. The Pinkus Chair and Usndeck Chair Funds are both dedicated for recruitment of new faculty. In addition the Schoenfeld Dermatology Fund is a focused on providing on additional funds for resident education. As many have you know, we do not receive fundings from Medicare (CMS). Our residency program is funded through the VA, Wayne State University School of Medicine and through our outside institutions and our endowed funds. We now have three endowed lectureships in dermatology. The first endowed lectureship is the Aronson Lectureship in Dermatology which was endowed by the Hamzavi family. In addition, there is a new Horton Endowed Lectureship in Dermatology, of which the first endowed lecture will occur this fall. Please stayed tuned for a date. This endowed lectureship will focus on dermalogic surgery. There will be a new Hamzavi Family Endowed Lectureship which will occur in January. This will be focused on care to underserved populations and contact dermatitis. Finally, we have three research funds, including the Messenger Endowed Fund, the Kerwin Endowed Fund and Murakawa Endowed Fund. These are used for resident and staff research projects. Currently the money is being used to study next generation sequencing as a tool for diagnoses and guiding therapy of patients with cutaneous follicular lymphoma. His work is being done by Wayne State University medical students and Department of Dermatology residents in conjunction with researchers from the Karmanos Cancer Institute and the Department of Pathology.

The department remains stable and is slowly growing. Much of this could not be achieved without the generous support of our past residents and friends.

From there I trained in dermatopathology at the University of California in Los Angeles under the extraordinary Dr. Scott Binder. I completed my training in surgical pathology at the University of Kansas in Kansas City, Kansas.

Working with Dr. Binder was the highpoint of my medical education. He taught me the approach I use in my diagnostics for skin disease. Outside of medicine, I love making beautiful and functional things and most of all, spending time with my amazing wife.



Departmental Research

Clinical research and scholarship are an important part of our residency program and department overall to fill gaps in our understanding dermatologic disease. We have many active clinical trials to provide the latest treatments especially highlighting the special skin of color population we care for. Residents have available funds from generous donations from alumni, the Hermann Pinkus Lecture Foundation, Wayne State Graduate Medical Education Seed Grant, and endowments that allow for resident scholarship. These would not be possible without your support. If you have potential research patients with severe hidradenitis suppurativa (HS) or any of the below diseases please reach out to us.

<u>Dr. Steven Daveluy</u> has undertaken cutting edge research in HS with an upcoming clinical trial for a new treatment and an investigator-initiated trial using battlefield acupuncture for control of pain in adults suffering from HS. He is also continuing trials on the use of cold water washing for seborrheic dermatitis, neem to treat rosacea, and others.

<u>Dr. Geoffrey Potts</u> is finishing up a clinical trial using Dupixent and studying benefits for atopic dermatitis patients with skin of color. An upcoming pharmaceutical-sponsored trial with a PO JAK inhibitor for vitiligo is coming Summer 2024.

<u>Dr. Aliya Hines</u> is continuing outcomes research on teledermatology cases across the VA especially prevalence of skin cancer in teledermatology cases and outcomes for those patients and follow up.

<u>Dr. Meena Moossavi</u> is working with Dr. Steven Daveluy on an upcoming NATIENS research project involving SJS/TEN at Detroit Receiving Hospital. The Detroit VA is also an alternate site for a nation-wide VA clinical trial for the chemoprevention of BCC.

All of our faculty have set aside additional time over their clinical duties to go above and beyond for research and scholarship with many important publications reviewing clinical questions we see in dermatology and especially skin of color. Special focus is on hidradenitis suppurativa for Dr. Daveluy, hyperhidrosis, alopecia, and supplements for Dr. Potts, care for veterans and quality improvement for Dr. Meena Moossavi, Dr. Hines on teledermatology and VA care, and Darius Mehregan on expertise in dermatopathology.

Mehdi Farshchian MD, PhD, FAAD Year of graduation: 2022

Dr. Farshchian completed his dermatology residency at Wayne State University in 2022. Before starting his residency, he spent several years in experimental and clinical dermatology research as a PhD student at the University of Turku in Finland. Later, he worked as a postdoctoral research fellow under the mentorship of the late Professor Jouni Uitto, a world-renowned scientist and dermatologist, at Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia, where he lived for two years after moving to the United States.

During his residency, Dr. Farshchian pursued his research interests and published numerous articles in top peer-reviewed journals in collaboration with Wayne State Dermatology faculty. His deep involvement in research during residency was recognized with several awards, including the Honorable Resident Research Award from the Michigan Dermatological Society, the Peter Svider Memorial Resident Scholarship Award, and the First Annual Amir MehreganMemorial Resident Research Award (shown in the photo with Department Chair Dr. DaruisMehregan).

After graduation and board certification in dermatology, Dr. Farshchian joined the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). He currently serves as an assistant professor and the director of Contact Dermatitis at UCLA Dermatology. He enjoys practicing and teaching at such an outstanding academic center. Recently, he was honored with the Teacher of the Year Award by UCLA dermatology residents for his dedication and passion for teaching. 
